Call for Contributions: Handbook of (Critical) Digital Humanities in American Studies

- Case Studies (DH and Cultural Heritage projects; Archives and DH; Manuscripts and text encoding initiatives; DH and crowdsourcing; DH and Humanities Data; DH and the Semantic Web; Python and Text Processing in DH, etc.)

One unique feature of this handbook is a corresponding digital platform that will feature open-access DH tools, applications, archives, and mapping projects, critically framed, presented, and updated.

Please note that each section of the handbook will feature essays by key researchers, PhD candidates, and young scholars, with the aim of introducing readers to a variety of perspectives.

The deadline for abstract submissions is **Sunday, April 30, 2023**. The advised deadline for the submission of finished essays and case studies is September 2024, with contributed essays ranging from 4,000-6,000 words and contributed case studies ranging from 2,000-3,000 words.
